I am very excited to announce that my contract at Forrestfield has been extended to Term 3. I feel very privileged to be able to lead such a close knit and friendly community and continue to see the implementation of many positive initiatives that staff are working hard to introduce and embed to improve the learning and overall wellbeing of our children.

Staff Learning

On Friday, 31 May, all staff at Forrestfield Primary School participated in a full day of professional learning. For the first half of the day, staff developed their understanding and ability to develop 'Daily Reviews,' which will be used in classrooms to transfer knowledge from students' short-term memory to their long-term memory. This will help their retention and recall of their learning. In the second half of the day, staff participated in a range of workshops that further built their awareness of how they can embed First Nations' perspectives across the curriculum.

Kindy Enrolments

The school is accepting Kindy enrolments for 2025. If you have a child that is turning 4 years of age by 30 June 2024, they are eligible to be enrolled in Kindy in 2025. The rest of the term we will cover narratives, focusing on bringing characters to life in our stories.
