Creative, Caring & Good in the Arts

Our students have been diving deep into their imaginations with ocean-themed art projects that celebrate creativity and care for the natural world. Using paper weaving, fishbowl scenes, and colourful sea creatures, we're exploring the beauty of Australia's oceans. A special thank you to Dr Lauren Peel (daughter of Mrs Peel!) for inspiring us with her book Ozzie Oceans, which brings marine life to life through playful alphabet shapes. Through these artistic adventures, we're learning to express ourselves while showing respect and appreciation for the world around us.

Teaching Sprint Focus: Activating Prior Knowledge

Each term, our teaching team focuses on a professional learning goal to strengthen classroom practice. This term's focus is "Activating Prior Knowledge" - a strategy that helps students connect what they already know with new learning. We're using structured approaches like Explicit Direct Instruction (EDI) to make sure every child is set up for success.

New Assembly Feature: Student Work Showcase

We've introduced a new tradition at our school assemblies! Each fortnight, two students from every class are selected to share a piece of learning they're proud of. This special segment gives students a chance to stand in front of the school and have their work displayed around the school. It's been wonderful to see the confidence and pride this has inspired in our learners.

Arts Department

We're splashing into creativity with ocean-inspired art using paper weaving, imaginative fishbowls, and brand-new sea creatures—plus a special inspiration from the amazing Dr Lauren Peel, daughter of Mrs Peel! Her Ozzie Oceans book shows Australia's sea life in fun alphabet shapes, and we'll be exploring those shapes and colours to spark our own underwater art adventures!

Science

The focus for this term is Physical Science. Physical sciences is the study of non-living things, including matter, energy, forces, motion, and how they interact. It helps students understand the rules and patterns that explain how the physical world works. Students have started exploring and investigating how sound and light travel, as well as the various ways that heat is transferred. We recently celebrated Science Week with some fun break time experiments:

Sustainability

This semester in Sustainability, students have been learning where food and natural fibres come from, how they are produced, and the journey they take from farm to plate. Students have been exploring sustainable practices, the importance of resources, and the role food and fibre play in our daily lives. As part of the unit, students will also have the opportunity to prepare, cook, and enjoy simple recipes that they can easily recreate at home
